From September we will roll out the scheme to new Year 7s, and they will have a full year of lessons.

It is all part of our long-term plan to grow our own musicians and ensure that performing arts at BFS is put on the map. Given the good news above about the school hall, **within a year or so we’ll hopefully a fully functioning orchestra AND somewhere for them to perform too.**


