Dear Parents & Carers,

As we approach the Christmas holidays I'm delighted to write to you with our latest newsletter, updating you on some of the activities and things that have gone on over the last half-term or so.

Mohammed Yasin visit

I was delighted to host a visit this month of our local MP Mohammed Yasin. Mohammed toured the school, met with our Head Boy and Head Girl, and was very impressed with the focus and dedication of the students. It was superb for us to host Mohammed and I thank him for taking the time out of his busy schedule to visit the school. I was able to talk to Mohammed about our ambitions for the school and its pupils, that we hope that all our pupils can go to university or have the option of doing so at 18, and that the majority will be able to go to "highly-selective" universities, and to talk about how we work in partnership with families and students to provide the best possible opportunities for our pupils.

We hosted a brilliant celebration of our alumni from BFS – last year's year 11 pupils. They were in high spirits and we swapped amazing stories and reflections on their time at BFS. Staff and ex-pupils were celebrating superb results. It was such a pleasure to welcome them back. We also welcomed back founding Principal of BFS, Mark Lehain. Mr Lehain delivered a humorous and inspirational speech reflecting on the lessons he and the staff and student team had learnt from setting up BFS in 2012. I was inspired by the visit of this group – trailblazers who joined the school in year 7 when it opened. I spoke to all the pupils the next day in my morning address to ask them, 'wonder what their legacy will be, what stories they might swap, and what achievements they might celebrate in 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021 or 2022'.

Visits to Bedford Free School

In early November, 15 Headteachers and Senior Leaders from schools across the country came to visit BFS. They wanted to see what it is that makes our school special. They were interested in the routines and structures, the very high expectations, our morning meetings, assembly programme, student leader initiatives, prep time, DEAR time and our lessons focussed on knowledge. Our 100% books and expectations with the achievement card were also a huge focus, as is the extensive CPD

we operate. You may not know that staff at BFS received professional learning every morning as part of our morning meetings before we go and get the pupils for the start of their day.

This reflects the excellent and growing reputation of BFS across the country. I'm especially proud that on these days we choose pupils to show our visitors round. They are not supervised or told what to say and the visitors always asked or say variants of two things:

"What amazing pupils you have – they are a credit to the school"

And

"is it always this calm – I didn't realise such a focussed atmosphere was possible".

The school continues to host visits from colleagues and education professionals once a month because we think that collaborating and learning from each other will benefit our pupils all the more, and we receive useful feedback from colleagues in other schools about how we can sometimes consider doing things even better.

Trips

Our extended school offer is a key part of our offer to our pupils and families. I know that you have agreed via our home-school agreement to support these trips and I thank you for doing so. I am pleased to report that we have had a significant number of successful trips this term. These include:

- A trip to the Higgins Art Gallery and museum, Bedford
- Warhammer elective trip to Games Workshop
- Football trip to MK Dons
- The year 7 faith tours trip
- Geography trip to Flatford Mill
- A trip to the Imperial War Museum for the Passchendaele at Home initiative

One of my personal highlights of this term was the year 7 pupils who came to see me to exhibit the extraordinary amount of knowledge they gained from their faith tour trip. I learnt a great deal from them.

As you would expect, feedback from all of our trips has indicated that pupils behave impeccably and make us very proud.

Year 7 Snowdon trip

I am beyond excited for the Year 7 Snowdon expedition. I am negotiating with Mrs Lehain to try to get myself as one of the staff supervisors on the trip, but I'm not sure I'm going to be able to. This is a new tradition at BFS – we want EVERY group of year seven pupils to experience climbing a mountain. We will exhibit courage, resilience, determination, teamwork, and discipline in doing so, and we will do so as a whole team. This will significantly expand our pupils' horizons and open them up to new possibilities, and we believe it to now be a BFS entitlement. It is really important to me that all our year 7 pupils are able to attend. Please attend the parents' information evening on this **Tuesday, 5th December, either at 6.00 – 6.45pm for 7KB and 7LT or 7.00 – 7.45pm for 7AE and 7CD**, please do sign up and provide your deposit. If there is anything that is stopping you from enthusiastically allowing your child to go on this trip, please book a meeting in with me. Whatever the barrier – financial, cultural, or safety-worries – I expect to be able to put your mind at ease so that as we agreed in the Home School Agreement, our first group of trailblazing year 7s to climb Snowdon can be supported to participate in these wider extra-curricular events.

Year 11 Mocks and next steps evening

The year 11 evening was a huge success. My enormous thanks to the parents for the 97% turnout. While we strive for 100% and always will, I want to recognise that this is significantly higher than any other school I know of, and your support will make such a huge difference to the pupils' achievement. Pupils received concrete next steps in their subjects, were reassured that the 'six strategies' that make up the science of learning feel hard, but that's because they work – learning literally changes the brain and hence is hard, and were able to talk to representatives from 6th forms

and colleges. If there is anything further we can do with regard to advice for colleges and 6th forms for your child, please do let us know.

PE Update:

We have competed in 75 fixtures since the beginning of term in September. Sports we participated in are football, basketball, netball, sports hall athletics, badminton, table tennis, boys' rugby and dodgeball. All fixtures (apart from rugby in this case) are for boys and girls and for every year group. As always, if you want to play for the school team, we make sure you get to play for the school team and as a result 92% of our pupils represented the school last year.

Our year 8 netballers went undefeated in their league campaign to win the league. Our Under 15 girls football team finished runners up in their league. Finally, the Under 15 basketball girls were **district champions**. They are progressing to the county championships which will be held in the new year.

Passchendaele at Home:

Passchendaele at Home is a nationwide initiative for schools and community groups funded by the Department for Communities and Local Government, marking the centenary of the Battle of Passchendaele.

The project is a challenge to discover graves in the UK that belong to British soldiers who were wounded at the Battle of Passchendaele, Belgium, but who died of their wounds in the UK. 12 students from year 7 have earned a place on the project by performing fantastically in their opening history assessments. They have chosen their own soldiers to research from a database of those that fell during the time during and slightly after the Battle of Passchendaele. The students have used the National Archives to research census records, medal rolls and if they are extremely lucky, WW1 service records (two thirds of which were destroyed in German bombing in WW2).

Highlights include Daisy of 7LT researching Private Walter Henry Long of the Sherwood Foresters, who died of his wounds suffered at Passchendaele aged 19. She discovered that he lived in Leicester and assisted in the family business of beer making at the age of 13! He suffered gunshot wounds in the front line on the 2nd of August 1917 and died just over a month later back in England.

The students conclude the project with a visit to the Imperial War Museum on Monday the 4th of December to meet the creator of the project and to discover more about life in the trenches.

Christmas Lunch

As you will be aware, our Christmas lunch is on Thursday 14th December. The menu is roast turkey with trimmings, vegetable & cheese strudel or a packed lunch. A reminder that to have a Christmas lunch, pupils must pay £3 in cash, the deadline has been extended to Monday 4th December to Miss Carter or Mrs Forster in our Finance office.

Friday 8th December

A reminder that the school will be closing early on **Friday 8th December**. I am sorry that we were unable to publish this at the start of this term. We are fortunate that three of our colleagues were able to be trained by Doug Lemov of "Teach Like a Champion" fame when he was over from the United States, and we are keen that all of our staff benefit from this cascaded training. On that Friday we are closing 95 minutes early and my colleagues will be working well beyond this time going the extra mile. I simply couldn't see another time that we could carve out without closing the school slightly early and I thank you for your forbearance. In addition, we are saying goodbye for a second time to Jim McGrath. Mr McGrath stepped in at very late notice in September to cover a vacancy we had in Science, and we are very grateful to him. He has now progressed in his career and has an exciting opportunity that he had to take at a local school. We wish him well. He is always welcome back at BFS and I am grateful for his assistance. We also wish him well with his soon-to-be extended family.
